
ROBBINS COLLECTION ANNUAL LECTURE IN JEWISH LAW, THOUGHT, AND IDENTITY:

Professor Rabbi Sharon Shalom

Prof. Rabbi Sharon Shalom is a scholar of Ethiopian Jewish law, culture, and practice. He is the Chair of the International Center for the Study of Ethiopian Jewry at Ono Academic College and a Professor at Bar-llan University. He also serves as the Rabbi of the "Kdoshei Israel" community in Kiryat Gat. His book, entitled *From Sinai to Ethiopia: The Halakhic And Conceptual World of Ethiopian Jewry*, explores Ethiopian Jewish traditions in the context of modern Israel and rabbinic Judaism.

Prof. Rabbi Shalom is joined by **Anthropologist Don Seeman**, a scholar of Ethiopian Jewry and Professor of Religion and Jewish Studies at Emory University.
